

Command Verb Guide

A command verb is a word which helps learners recognise how they need to answer each question of your assignment and it will be the first word of each question, highlighted in **bold**.

Command verbs are providing you with direction of $\underline{\text{how}}$ each question needs to be answered and in how much $\underline{\text{detail}}$. The below table gives examples of some of the command verbs which are included in an assignment:
